Thanking God for the New Covenant Scriptures


הנה ינוים באים גאם יהוה וכרתי את בית ישראל ואת בית יהודה ברית הדשה

The New Testament is called *B'rit HaChadashah* in Hebrew, meaning "the New Covenant" (the word *B'rit* means "covenant" and *Chadashah* means "new"). Just like the Torah and Haftarah blessings, Messianic Jewish believers thank the LORD God of Israel for the gift of the New Covenant Scriptures before and after reading from them.

Blessed are You, LORD our God, King of the universe, Who gave to us the Messiah Jesus and the commandments of the New Covenant.


Blessed art You, LORD, Giver of the New Covenant.
