




## Qal Passive Participles


Present Plural יְמַן עָבֶר – רָבִּים





## Definition and Examples

Passive participles often function as attributive or predicative adjectives, though they can also a substantive noun. Passive participles express verbal action in a passive voice, meaning what is described by the participle receives the action expressed by the participle. For Qal Passive participles, notice that the endings are *similar* to adjective endings:



## **Examples:**

- ו. בִּי עַשִּׁיתַ זֹאת אַרוּר אַתַּה
- "Because you have done this, <u>cursed</u> are you..." (Gen. 3:14)
- 2. בָרוּך יְהֹנָה אֱלֹהֵי שֵׁם
- "Blessed is the LORD God of Shem.." (Gen. 9:26)
- גּרוּכִים אַהֶּם לַיהוֶה עֹשֵׂה שְׁמַיִם וָאָרֶץ 3.
- "You are <u>blessed</u> of the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth." (Psalm 115:15)
- 4. בְּרוּכִים אַתֶּם לַיהוֶה כִּי חֲמַלְתֶּם עָלָי
- "You are <u>blessed</u> of the LORD, for you had compassion on me." (1 Sam. 23:21)
